

THREE SENATORS TO BE APPOINTED

Ottawa, Nov. 7.—Five important appointments await the return of Premier King and his Western colleagues to this city at the end of the present week from their tour of the Pacific Coast.

Three of those are to fill vacancies in the Senate—two in Quebec and one in New Brunswick, the latter being caused by the death of Hon. George W. Fowler. The name most prominently mentioned in connection with this New Brunswick seat in the Upper House is that of Hon. W. E. Foster, former Premier of that province.

The Quebec vacancies are for the districts in which are the Hon. Dr. H. S. Bland, and as the latter is in Europe attending the International Opium Conference, these two Quebec seats are not likely to be filled until Dr. Bland returns at the end of this month. The deaths of Senators Bolduc and Godbout caused the vacancies.

A successor to Hon. W. B. Nantel on the Dominion Railway Board has yet to be named. Mr. Nantel retired on Oct. 1, having reached the superannuation age. J. A. C. Ethier, member of the House of Commons for Laval and Two Mountains, is believed to

by the Republican State organization, and Senator Harrell, who will be senior senator from Oklahoma after March 4, in a speech he made before the Republican State Committee, was quoted by the Oklahoma newspapers as extending an invitation to the Klanmen to join the Republican Party. He is quoted as saying all were welcome.

In Indiana, where Mr. Jackson, the Klan candidate for Governor, appears to have won by a majority of more than 100,000, the Klan let it be known a year in advance of the Republican primaries that he was their choice. That he was to be the Klan candidate and that he would win the Republican nomination was foretold in the New York Times in the summer of 1923. Following his nomination one of the first of the Republican leaders to endorse Mr. Jackson was Senator James E. Watson, who has consistently refrained from saying or doing anything that could be construed as antagonistic to the hooded order.

The returns from Kansas tell their own story. Mr. Paulsen won despite the anti-Klan candidacy of William Allen White, and almost as impressively as did Senator Capper and the President. The fight the Klan made for the Governorship of Kansas precipitated a contest which for bitterness has few parallels in the political history of that State.

Double Victory in Colorado.

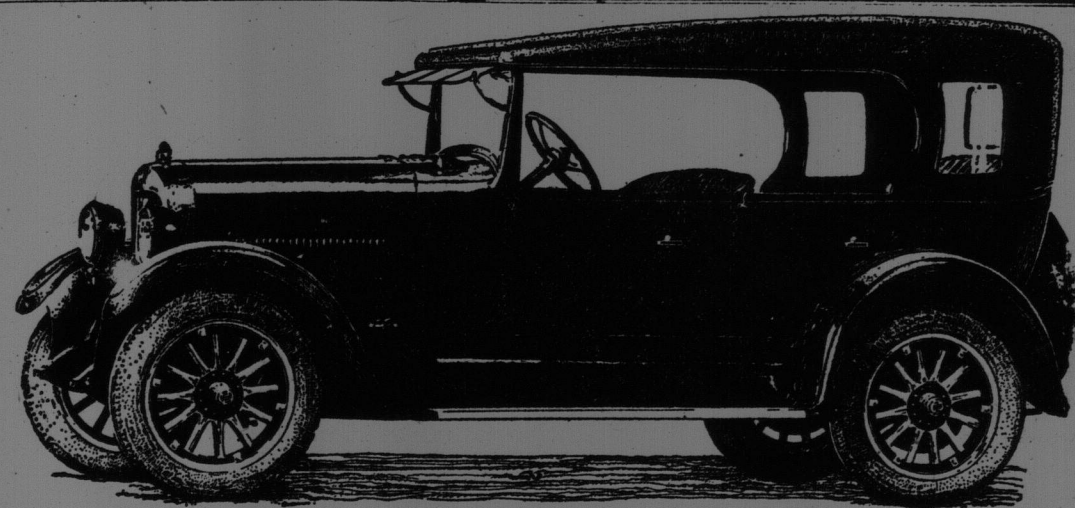
The Klan triumph in Colorado was double-barrelled. They have apparently elected both a Governor and a United States senator in that State. Clarence C. Morley, whose election as Governor is indicated, is said to be the Khaliff of the Denver Klan, while Colonel Rice Means, elected to the Senate to serve out the unexpired term of the late Senator Nicholson, is also said to be a member of the organization.

An official photograph of the programme of the celebration of the first anniversary of the organization of the Realm of Colorado of the Ku Klux Klan listed both Mr. Morley and Colonel Means as among the speakers. This celebration was held in Denver in May of this year. According to the programme the speech on "Americanism" was made by Mr. Morley, who was stated to be at the time "Khaliff-elect of Klan No. 1," while one of the other principal addresses was made by Colonel Means.

In the event Mr. Linderman defeats Senator Thomas J. Walsh in Montana the Republicans will have elected a third senator whose Klan affiliation and support is a subject of general comment in his State. Mr. Linderman was prominent in the old A. P. A., and it is admitted even by the Montana Republican State Committee that he won the nomination in the primary largely

as a result of his endorsement by the Montana Klan. These are the outstanding triumphs of the Klan in the election. When the Democrats of Texas, Arkansas, Oklahoma and Louisiana repudiated the Klan last summer there were many who say in those crushing defeats the

beginning of the end of the hooded order. What happened would indicate, however, that the masked organization is still a force to be reckoned with in Western politics.

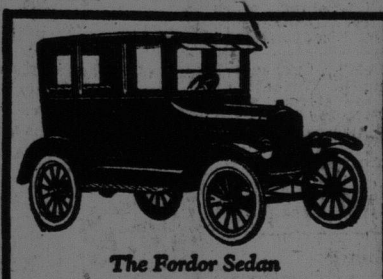


MONTREAL HOTELS LOSE MANY TOWELS

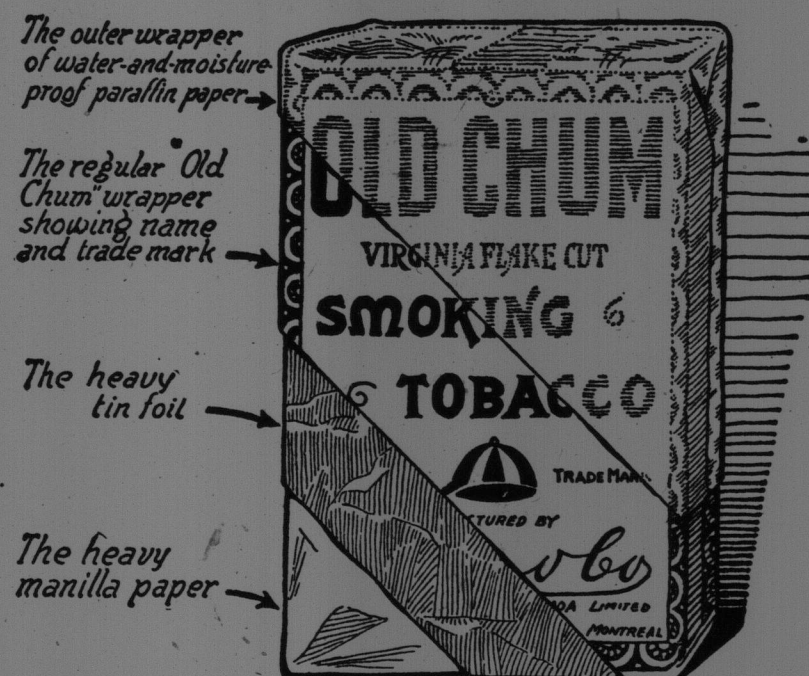
