

Fear of Boycott Stirs Germany

Taking Steps To Escap e Effec of Prejudice

Teuton Trade Trick - Made by German Firms, Goods Will be Stamped "British Manufacture"

Germany has already begun to take teps to escape the effect of the prejudice hich she knows will operate against oods of German manufacture after the var. The first move reported in this frection is a typical Teutonic trade

Recent mail advices from the Nether lands state that great efforts are being made by German firms to secure contracts for delivery of goods in Holland over a period of two years after the war, with a proviso that the contract prices shall be decreased as production cheapens. Big contracts are being negotiated for delivery of straw and felt hats. To accommodate the Dutch demand, the felt hats, though supplied by German firms, are to be marked "Made in England," or "British manufacture." I am informed that one big contract for two years for the delivery of straw hats commences with deliveries for this seasen, and that, while nominally of German manufacture, these straws are of Italian origin, the Italian trade mark having been covered with a German mark. nds state that great efforts are being
