POLISH BOYCOTT OF KAISER IS ONLY A PARTIAL SUCCESS

Posen, Germany, Aug. 26.—The German Emperor and Empress, accompanied by their sons, the Prince Regent of Bavaria, Lieut.-General Alberto Pollo, chief of the Italian general staff and many other prominent persons arrived here today for a two days sojourn, during which they will review the Fifth army corps and dedicate the new city hall, and the chapel in Posen Castle.

The Polish newspapers and the Polish nationalist leaders attempted to organize a general boycott of the festivities as a mark of their displeasure at the Prussian government policy for the Germanization of the Polish provinces. This, however, was only partly successful. The Polish aldermen of the city declined the invitations sent to them, but many of the Polish nobility have decided to attend the banquets. None of the Polish buildings are decorated with bunting and flags. Large crowds turned out to witness the Imperial display.
