NEW WOMAN IN MODEL MURDER

New York Police Trail the Sweetheart of Man Who Has Been Under Suspicion.

New York, April 2.—A woman now is the newest central figure in police pursuit of clues to a solution of the mystery of the murder of Dorothy Keesan, who was chloroformed to death a score of days ago.

It was learned today that the police had for some time been trailing the sweetheart of a man who for several days has been under suspicion, chiefly because he has been unable to account for his actions in the hours between midnight preceding the murder and eight o'clock the next morning.

The woman they said was being trailed in the hope that she might attempt to dispose of some of the jewels or other objects that were stolen from the model's West Fifty Seventh street apartment. She already has been interviewed by the police and has provided the suspected man with an alibi for the hours before and after the murder with the exception of the eight hours between midnight and eight o'clock.

Ex-Kaiser and Bride of Few Months Said To Have Separated

Princess Hermine Declared to Have Gone to Near Relatives

Doorn Report is That Separation Took Place a Fortnight Ago When it was Said She Had Left to Inspect Family Estates in Germany.

(Canadian Press) York, Eng., April 2.—Reports of a serious disagreement between former Emperor William and Princess Hermine, his bride of a few months, which have cropped out from time to time since the first of the year, are revived today by the Doorn correspondent of the Yorkshire Evening News, who says he has learned "from a singularly well informed source" that the ex-Kaiser and his wife have definitely separated as a result of domestic troubles.

The actual separation is more than a fortnight old, he declares, "but the Emperor's life is reported to be very solitary and his establishments very simple, for although his private means are still ample, they are not under his control."

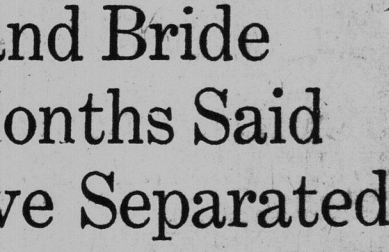
It was reported at the St. John's hospital that Joseph Mila was injured recently, was seen better today morning and his case was regarded as hopeful.
