The Kirk-Session notice with satisfaction that the special collections on the Communion Sabbaths, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas, amounting in all to \$741.09, were sufficient to meet the expenditure of the year, for the relief of the poor through the Kirk-Session, as well as for other sessional purposes.
