ON the recommendation of the Honorable the Minister of Customs and under authority of the 8th section of the Act 31 Vic., Chap. 6, intitled: "An Act respecting the Customs." His Excellency has been pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following ports in the Province of New Brunswick shall be and the same are hereby declared to be Out Ports of Entry, under the Survey of the respecting Ports hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

Resigouche, to be an Out port, under the Survey of the Port of Dalhousie.

The Port of New Brandon, in the County of Gloucester, to be an Out port, under the Survey of the Port of Bathurst.

The Port of Rockland, in the County of Westmorland, to be an Out port, under the Survey of the Port of Dorchester.
