A NEW CHANGEABLE GEAR.

The latest in the bicycle line is a chainless triple gear machine invented by C. E. D. Fisher, of Melbourne. The principal feature of the new system is the elimination of the chain and the introduction of a triplicate gear, which can be modified at the will of the rider.
