

Last evening at the First Presbyterian church the pastor, Rev. F. H. Larkin, preached an earnest and forceful discourse on the high aims and results of the Young Men's Christian Association. Our bodies were temples of the living God. They should be reverenced as such. All its members should be consecrated to the Lord and used for His glory. In this connection Mr. Larkin made a strong plea for total abstinance. It was the duty of everyone to glorify God with every part of his body.

He expects us so to act that our faith may pects us so to act that our faith may grow and thus do wonderful things to the upholding of His cause and His kingdom. The most unforgiving people, said the speaker, are to be found in the Christian church and yet they will pray Him to forgive their sins; to grant them that forgiveness they deny to those about them. This was one of the things which must be overcome if we would obey the words of the text and work out our salvation.
