PASSING CIVIC ESTIMATES.

A Busy Meeting of the Treasury Board Yesterday Afternoon.

A meeting of the treasury board was held yesterday afternoon. A sub-committee reported that the rate of storage for apples in the new frost-proof warehouse would be one per cent. per barrel. The report was laid on the table after some discussion. The board of works estimates amounting to \$70,000 passed. Aid. Frink remarked that in the last twenty years one-half a million had been spent on streets, and today there is nothing to show for the expenditure. The fire department estimates of \$43,900 passed after some discussion. The proposed increase in the police estimates was a stumbling block and laid over. The estimates for lights, \$24,500, were referred back to the safety board. The school board estimates amount to \$57,948. The interest and the subsidy fund amount amounted to \$110,533.48 for this year; \$57,498.36 was the total amount last year. Aid. Tilley moved that Gordon Boyne, commissioner in Kings ward, receive \$150 for his services. Carried.

The Local Team. Manager Joe Page arrived in the city yesterday and last evening at the Dufferin Hotel completed his team to represent St. John for the 1905 season. The players he has signed on are Mills, catcher; D. McEschen and Nesbitt, pitchers; Carson, McGuffigan, Howe, Woods, Cooper and Cregan. Thompson of last season's Furnham team will play short stop. Mr. Page says that the boys will commence practice just as soon as the diamond is clear of ice and snow, and Tomkins will be here in about two weeks. Arrangements have been about completed for grounds and the fans can look forward to seeing some good ball this season.
