SETTLERS FROM THE STATES OPPOSED TO RECIPROCITY

Farmers Fear Rule of Trusts and Believe in Fostering Canadian National Spirit—Threw their Influence Among the Grain Growers Against Putting Up Separate Contracts.

Winnipeg, Man., Aug. 9.—The most persistent advocate of reciprocity with the United States today in the Prairie Provinces is the salesman for farm implements whose manufacturing plants are located in Chicago, Moline, Ill., St. Louis, St. Paul, and other big centres of the machine industry on the other side of the line. It is difficult for the eastern farmer to realize how powerful is the influence this class of business men have in Western Canada and how probably more numerous than all other classes of travelling men combined in the trade of the Prairie Provinces.

Opposed to Reciprocity. The ex-American farmer, however, of the Prairie Provinces is opposed to the reciprocity pact. This has been demonstrated hundreds of times during the past few months in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta. He has entered into the national spirit on this side of the line, and prefers to build up home industries. He is the type of man who stood for the enormous tariff in the States under the impression that it was in the interest of the nation to build up home industries.
