THE NEWS IN SHORT METER

LOCAL. Lard is Higher. Canadian lard has advanced in the primary markets half a cent a pound. The local price is from 21 3/4 to 13 cents, but this will be advanced this week.

A Fairville Option. Joseph O'Brien, of Fairville, has given an option to outside parties on a strip of land near the head of Fairville. There are fifteen acres in the piece, and it is understood it is wanted for building purposes.

A Fairville Runaway. An exciting runaway took place in Fairville on Friday afternoon. A horse attached to an express wagon became frightened on Church avenue and dashed down Main street, narrowly escaping running down a lad named Waters. It was finally stopped by Mr. Benjamin Ellis. This harness was badly broken but the wagon was not damaged.

Presbyterians Favor Union. Ottawa, March 23.-Returns announced today regarding the vote of Presbyterian churches in the Ottawa presbytery indicate a vote overwhelmingly in favor of church union. Out of 43 churches or missions represented in the presbytery 45 sent in returns and of these 43 voted in favor of church union.

Italy in Trouble. Paris, March 23.-According to an interview with a prominent American well acquainted with Italian affairs, and who spends a part of each year near Milan, it would appear that economic conditions in Italy at present are far worse than the censored despatches make out. The Tripoli war comes very near being the ruin of Italy, which is in fact seething with anarchy and discontent.

Floating Dock for Vancouver. New York, March 23.-A London cable says that a number of British and French financiers have decided to promote a scheme for building a floating dock for Vancouver. The capital for the scheme has already been subscribed and joint boards have been formed in London and Paris in connection with the project. The dock will have a total length of 600 feet, a depth of 55 feet and width of 80 feet.

Kaiser in Vienna. Vienna, Austria, March 23.-Emperor William, accompanied by Princess August William and Princess Victoria Louise, arrived here this morning. They will spend the day with the Emperor Francis Joseph at Schoen Brunne castle. After Joseph's party will proceed to Venice on a visit to King Victor Emmanuel of Italy, and will then continue their journey to Corfu, where the Emperor is to spend his usual summer vacation.

The Trouble Over Queens. Kingston, Ont., March 23.-The conference here yesterday between the trustees of Queens and representatives of the Presbyterian Church regarding the Christian clause in Queens' bill concluded at 12.30 midnight. It was decided to moderate the clause so that any one of "good Christian character" may be appointed a professor in the institution. The clause as originally written required a religious test of Christianity for any professor. "There is no difference whatever," said leading Jews this morning. "We are not satisfied at all and we will carry the case to England." Friends of Queens say their clause as moderated does not deter Jews from becoming professors.
