Approach of Nomination Day Finds Copp and His Friends with No Chance of a Ticket—Government Candidates Create Excellent Impression Throughout Northumberland.

Newcastle, June 7.—There is absolutely no hope of A. B. Copp securing an opposition ticket in this county, so many liberals are followers of Hon. John Morrisey and D. P. MacLachlan and are perfectly satisfied that the Fleming government is the best for the province, that the opposition stands no chance.

Opposition Scored In Able Speeches

Splendid Meeting at Mechanic's Settlement on Behalf of Government Candidates—Convincing Arguments Advanced.

Mechanics Settlement, June 7.—On Wednesday evening Messrs. G. H. Adair and Fred M. Sprout addressed a meeting on behalf of Messrs. Murray, Jones and Dixon at Mechanics Settlement. Owing to the late hour at which the notices of the meeting reached Mechanics, not as many persons were in attendance as might otherwise have been present; still a good sized audience were there and listened to the various arguments submitted on behalf of the government with evident satisfaction.

Thomas Moore was elected as chairman and introduced the speakers and Mr. Adair first addressed those present in a lucid and convincing manner, producing facts and figures which proved conclusively that the Hazen Fleming administration had made good every pledge and had governed the province in a most satisfactory way, augmenting its revenues very largely, and having spent more money on roads and bridges and in the advancement of the agricultural and other departments than the old government ever did, and without adding to the permanent debt. He also made clear the great benefits that had been derived from providing school books to the people at wonderfully reduced cost and not having made an administration a burdensome charge to the people, the cost of the whole work having been less than \$1,000 during their tenure of office. He predicted the sure return to power of the Fleming government and in conclusion was heartily applauded.

Mr. Sprout next addressed the audience with enthusiasm received and in the course of his remarks shattered the simple and unfounded charges of the opposition policy, stating why he had decided not to again appeal to the electors, refusing to be charged that he had been so vigorously reported as to his having been forced out of the contest, stating that he and his late colleagues had always worked in unison for the best interest of the county.

He made many references to the expenditure of the public money and gave proof that Kings County had been well looked after. He also referred to the manner in which the public money of the province was now safeguarded so that every dollar had to be accounted for and giving an idea of the safe provisions now under the new audit act whereby holders and grafters could not plunge their hands into the provincial treasury as was done so freely under the old administration. He also alluded to the remarks of Mr. Copp who recently at Hampton condemned the New Brunswick Telephone Co. as being a creature of monopoly, showing that the same Mr. Copp while a member of the old administration had supported the legislation that formed the monopoly, but now was talking the other way. The present government had passed an act giving the people of Studholm, Springfield and Norton and two parishes in Queens power to erect a new telephone company if desired and enabling them to relieve themselves of any over charges in this respect whenever they desired so to do.

The crown land policy and the increased collection of stampage was then forcibly alluded to showing that the present government had succeeded in collecting many thousands of dollars more than did the late government without in any degree depleting the crown lands of the province.

In conclusion he asked the electors one and all to give Messrs. Jones and Murray and Dixon, the farmer candidate, their full support, promising that on the 20th of June next he fully expected to see them triumphantly returned. In concluding he was loudly applauded and the chairman called for a vote of thanks for the addresses which was unanimously adopted.

Mechanics Settlement district may be counted on safely in giving the present government a hearty support.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

Any person who is the sole head of a family or any person over 18 years of age who has been a resident of a Dominion land in Canada, Saskatchewan or Alberta, is eligible to apply for a homestead. The applicant must apply in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions. A father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of the intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within one mile of the homestead on a farm of at least 50 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$1.00 per acre.

Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-empted six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry, including the time required to carry home and patent) and cultivate fifty acres.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and who desires to pre-empt may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$1.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.
