MASTER OF MIRTH IN MUSIC

Master of Mirth is the title given to Henry Clay Barnabee, known in Europe as one of the most active singers of opera roles of his time. He was the original Sheriff of Nottingham in "Robin Hood," and played Sir Joseph Porter in "Pinafore." He was for over sixty years known as the only man who could sing "The Cork Leg" and the ballad "O Loving Heart, Trust On," written for him by Goldschalk, the famous composer. Mr. Barnabee was a leading spirit of the old Boston Ideal Opera Company, which continued for many years as one of the most popular musical organizations known to opera lovers. In later life he retained his splendid quality of voice, still singing many of the songs which were made famous.
