

weapons battle (blanks of course), ensued and the majority of the remaining terrorists were arrested, including the two ringleaders, "Kennadi" and "Stinsonov." At the same time, several terrorists who had infiltrated local business establishments in Hartland, and who had been identified and kept under surveillance, were rounded up. By Wednesday evening, only five members of the BPPLA were believed to be still at large.

Thursday morning, President Stroganoff and his official party arrived on schedule via military helicopter and, due to the organization of "J" Division

Security Systems Section in co-operation with all other police and military departments, their visit was without incident.

Despite tight security in Hartland during the exercise, the BPPLA did manage to successfully "blow up" an Anglican church and an oil storage depot, and to plant explosives on the famous covered bridge. An enemy sniper was credited with wounding one member of the friendly forces.

Civilian press and military observers were present during the exercise which received news coverage Canada-wide and
