HONOR ROLL

The first publication of the Force's honor roll of members killed on duty appeared in the original RCMP Quarterly magazine, vol. 1, no. 1, July 1933. Updates to the honor roll appeared in volumes 18 #4 and 29 #2, bringing the account of members who had given their lives in service to the Force and Canada up to the year 1963. It is time for another update; time to remember our comrades who gave their lives in the performance of their duties. In consideration of those readers who do not have the earlier editions of the Quarterly to refer to, we are publishing the complete honor roll of the Force here. **Ed**.

- 1. **Sub-Cst. John Nash, Reg. No. 135** Accidentally killed while on duty near Fort Macleod, North West Territories, (N.W.T.), March 11, 1876.
- 2. **Sub-Cst. George Mahoney, Reg. No. 409** Drowned while crossing the South Saskatchewan River on patrol from Battleford to Fort Walsh, N.W.T., on June 19, 1877.
- 3. Cst. Marmaduke Graburn, Reg. No. 335 Murdered while on duty near Fort Walsh, N.W.T., on November 17, 1879, by person or persons unknown thought to be Indians who fled into the U.S.A.
- 4. Cst. Claudius S. Hooley, Reg. No. 181 Drowned in the Belly River on July 24, 1880, while on patrol from Wood Mountain to Fort Macleod, N.W.T.
- 5. **Recruit Cst. Adam Wahl** (Had not been given a reg. no. at the time of his death.) Drowned in the Missouri River near Fort Union, Montana, while en route with other recruits from eastern Canada to Fort Macleod, N.W.T., May 25, 1882.
