M. L'AGENT,

I have the honour to transmit to you herewith Regulations fixing the maximum limits of the rates of statistical dues to be levied on different categories of merchandise imported and exported by the frontiers of the Principality.

As you will see, these Regulations offer all the desired guarantees that the statistical dues will in no way burden trade more than is strictly necessary in order to cover the expenses of the statistical service in our custom-houses.

In the hope that Her Britannic Majesty's Government will recognize that the dues thus limited will cause no hindrance to the free development of trade, I avail, &c.

*Statistical Dues.*

Statistical dues shall be levied in the manner indicated below.

Ten centimes a package, with the following exceptions:—

1. Postal parcels shall be exempt from all statistical dues.
2. Paris tacks and nails of all kinds imported in cases or in casks, as well as window glass, shall be subject to a duty of 10 centimes per 100 kilog.
