re: Ilailawatash Indian Reserve.

We, as Solicitors of the Brittingham and Young Company Limited, have taken up with Mr. Perry, Indian Agent at Vancouver, the purchase of the Ilailawatash Indian Reserve at Meslielet River, North Arm of Burrard Inlet and we understand from Mr. Perry that the matter is now before you at Ottawa. We suggested to Mr. Perry that it might be advisable for us to write you in connection with the matter, giving some particulars as to the Brittingham and Young Company's position in that vicinity.

The above Company owns Dominion Timber Berths 510, 389, and 469 in the Railway Belt on the east side of Indian River, on which there are many million feet of timber, and a booming ground in Burrard Inlet immediately fronting on the Indian Reserve. The Company intends to log these limits and for this purpose it is necessary to build a railroad from
