

the same day the License was issued by you; and there was no evidence whatever that he intended to become a settler. However under the circumstances reported by you Mr. Roll is entitled to the License issued, but you should take care to see that the land is prepared for cultivation on which he cuts the timber.

You appear to have conveyed the idea to the Settlers that "Settlers Timber Licenses" are to be withdrawn, or rather that they are not in future to be issued; and you say that they are agitated in consequence. I have to inform you that the Department has no such intention; but simply wishes to guard against an abuse of the privilege
