or the engineer that we did not get the spet that we wanted - Capt Jim was the name of the surveyor; and the Civil Engineer teld me Ok there will be no one interfere with you here - there will be no whites come to the country. You will have all that land - that is what he told me - I am elder than they and our fathers were cultivating there; all their brothers and all their sisters and the line did net take in the places we wanted, and new the whites have that spet there now. No one found fault with anyone when I was a young man, and when I was a young man I became religious so I teld my Tribes not to interfere with anyone. That is what I am telling you up here - I am speaking where the whites have come new - I am just telling you my grievance about that because the eld people used to cultivate there; and we expect our children will got this land after we have gene, and new there is a whitemen in there new and he is going to sell it right away - When a man has worked his land he calculates that his children will get it after him. I am very glad that you teld us you would give us some land previded it was not held by whitemen. When the first Commissiener O'Reilly first came here, he was in an awful hurry and we could not get along with him very welll. Capt. Jim he was doing the surveying and he was just the same - he was in an awful hurry to, and I teld Judge O'Reilly we would like to get the places where we used to out our hay.

Mr Commiss oner Mc Kenna: Where is that?

Bridge river, just across the mountain, and he teld me he was in a great hurry - The next time I come along, said O'Retlly, I will give you that - That is all pre-empted by the whitemen, but there is no one there yet. I den't knew whether that is private or Government land; and if the Government has that land yet, will you kindly give it to my people so that my people will be with me all the timen- Some of my Tribe have left me new - Mr Green of Victoria, he teld me that we could have all the land north of the Reserve up the mountains; from the slide down to here, and I said all right:
