Y., according to the printed-report just come to hand, the sum of nine thousand four hundred and thirty-seven dollars was raised last year for the purpose of ecclesiastical education.

We trust, therefore, that in a matter of such extreme importance our Catholic people will do their duty, and thus bring upon themselves and families the abundant blessings of God.

We d-sire the Rev. Clergy to take up this collection each year on the first and succeeding Sundays of October and to send the proceeds to the chancellor of the Archdiocese. The collection should be taken up by the priests themselves.

This Pastoral shall be read in all our churches on the first Sunday after its reception, or as soon afterwards as possible.

We wish the clergy to preserve this Pastoral, with the view of reading it each year on the occasion of the collection for Ecclesiastical Education.
