

at any time during Term, by a public notice affixed in the Hall, and by summons sent to all the members within five miles of the College at least two days before the date of meeting.

IV. All questions in the Convocation shall be decided by the majority of votes of the members present; the presiding Officer to have a casting vote in case of an equality of votes.

V. It is the office of the Convocation to confer Degrees according to the Statutes; to admit and incorporate members of other Universities; to grant Letters testamentary; to grant Dispensations in cases and provided for by the Statutes and not contrary to them; and to deprive of Degrees in cases defined by the Statutes.

VI. The Convocation is also hereby authorized and empowered to make Regulations respecting the course of Instruction and Discipline to be pursued in the College and the University; and to elect Proctors, Examiners, and other Officers who may be thought necessary for those purposes, with such salaries as the Council shall appoint.

TIT. VI.—Of the President.

I. The Archbishop of the Province is the President of the College.

II. It is the office of the President to preside at all Meetings of the Council, which he may think fit to attend, in the absence of the Chancellor.

III. The President shall also preside in the absence of the Chancellor, at all meetings of the Convocation, and of the Officers of the College, which he may think fit to attend.

IV. The President is hereby authorized and empowered to appoint the Chaplain, when a Salary for that office shall be allotted by the Council.

TIT. VII.—Of the Vice-President.

I. The Residence of the President in the College, and his personal superintendence of its affairs, being his responsibility with the fulfilment of his Ecclesiastical duties, a Vice-President shall be appointed as before provided, to hold his office during good behaviour.
