MARCH.—What the soil really includes nobody knows; though what it yields every one may easily ascertain for himself. The great object in view is not to extort the greatest possible quantity out of the soil, but to learn to economize our resources. A boy may calculate the amount of productive power left in a field after a hundred years, even though only one half per cent. of its original value should be annually taken out of it, but the addition of this half per cent. a year, if he would learn to provide for it, would make it yield the same crop for another hundred years, and in fact for an unlimited time.

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
