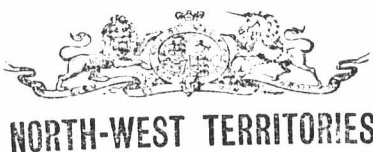

Emigrants, \$15; Children under 12 years, \$8; 150 lbs. personal baggage free. Extra luggage, 3 cents per 100 lbs. (No horses, oxen, wagons, or heavy farming implements can be taken.)

THE MODE OF CONVEYANCE.

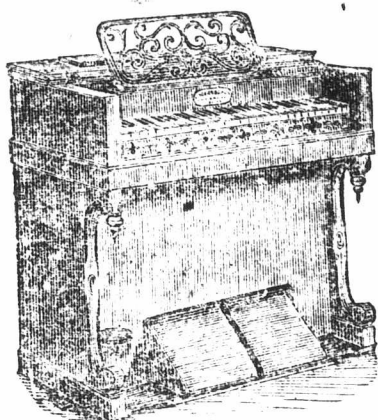
By Railroad from Toronto to Collingwood or Sarnia.
By Steamer from Collingwood or Sarnia to Fort William.
45 miles by wagon from Fort William to Shebandowan Lake.
34 miles broken navigation in open boats, from Shebandowan Lake to the North-West Angle of the Lake of the Woods.
55 miles by Cart or Wagon from North-West Angle Lake of the Woods to Fort Garry.
Between Fort William and Fort Garry, butts and tents will be provided for the accommodation of emigrants on the Portages. Passengers should take their own supplies. Provisions will, however, be furnished at cost prices at Shebandowan Lake, Fort Frances and the North-West Angle, Lake of the Woods.

THROUGH TICKETS TO FORT GARRY VIA FORT WILLIAM.

Can be had at Toronto, at the stations of the Northern, Great Western and Grand Trunk Railways.
Emigrants are requested to take notice that packages are limited to 150 lbs. weight for convenience of transport on the portages, and that baggage and supplies must not exceed 450 lbs. for any one emigrant.

After the 1st day of August next, the RIV. RIVER ROUTE will be in a condition to admit of the transport of heavy articles.

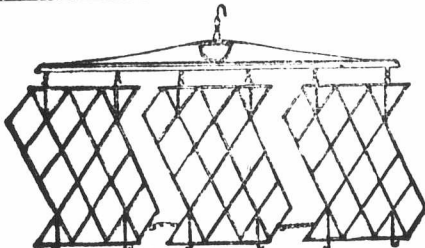

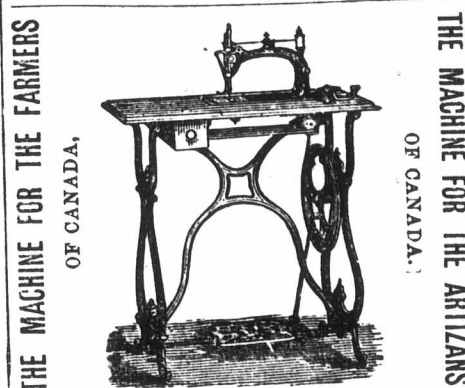
