ORDERED, That the question of concurrence be now put, separately, on each paragraph of the Address reported.

And the first to the third paragraphs, being again severally read, and the question of concurrence being separately put upon each, they were severally agreed unto by the House.

The Fourth paragraph being again read,

Mr. Stuart moved, seconded by Mr. Lee, to amend the same by leaving out the words "by a recourse to Martial Law."

The House divided upon the question, and the names being called for, they were taken down as followeth:

Yeas

Mestrs. Dénéchau, Pozer, Bellet, Gauvreau, Blanchet, Lee, Stuart, Bruneau, Borgia, Tasebereau and Debartzch.

Nays

Meffrs. Cuthbert, Mure and Bell.

So it was carried in the affirmative.

The question being then put upon the fourth paragraph, as amended, it was agreed to unanimously.

The fifth and fixth paragraphs were then severally read, and the question of concurrence being separately put thereon, they were agreed to by the House.

The seventh paragraph being again read,

Mr. Stuart moved in amendment thereto, seconded by Mr. Bellet, to
