Excellency to His Lordship, in April last, inclosing the Address of the House relating to the granting of Crown Lands.

Ordered, that the same lie on the Table.

Mr. Pagan, by leave, presented a Petition of the Inhabitants of the Parish of West-Isles, in the County of Charlotte, praying that some further measures might be adopted for regulating the Fisheries there.

Which being read, was ordered to be received, and lie on the Table.

On motion of Mr. Pagan, ordered, that Mr. Warren Hatheway, now attending, be called to the Bar of the House, to give information relating to the above Petition.

Mr. Hatheway was accordingly called in--and, after giving the information required, was ordered to withdraw.

The House then adjourned until to-morrow morning at eleven o'clock.
