Bill, intituled, "An Act to incorporate the Town of St. Ours." And then he withdrew.

On motion of Mr. Macdonald (Toronto West), seconded by the Honorable Mr.

Cameron (Peel),

Ordered, That the Bill from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act to repeal "the Act to legalize certain assessments in the City of Toronto, and to enable the said "City to recover the taxes rated and charged," be now read the first time.

The Bill was accordingly read the first time; and ordered to be read a second time,

on Wednesday next.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Solicitor General Cockburn, seconded by the

Honorable Mr. Attorney General Macdonald,

Ordered, That the Bill from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act to amend the Law respecting the appointment of Recorders in Upper Canada," be now read the first time.

The Bill was accordingly read the first time; and ordered to be read a second time, to-morrow.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee on the Bill from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act to enable the Municipality of the Town of "Belleville to purchase a site for a public Cemetery, and to exempt the Roman Catholic "rate-payers of the said Municipality from taxation on account of the same;" and after some time spent therein, Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. Ross (Prince Edward) reported, That the Committee had gone through the Bill, and made amendments thereunto.

Ordered, That the Report be now received.

Ordered, That the Bill, with the amendments, be read the third time, to-morrow.

Ordered, That the Bill be read the third time, to-morrow.

Ordered, That the Bill be read the third time, to-morrow.

Ordered, That the Bill be read the third time, to morrow.

The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee on the Bill to provide for the sale of the Rectory Lands in this Province; and after some time spent therein, Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. Cartwright reported, That the Committee had gone through the Bill, and made several amendments thereunto.
