CAP. XVI.

AN ACT to provide for the Contingent Expenses of the Legislature during the present Session.

[Passed 29th April, 1844.]

HEREAS it is expedient to provide for the Contingent Expenses of the Legislature:

1.—Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened, that from and out of such monies as shall from time to time remain in the hands of the Treasurer, unaped for contingen-propriated, there be granted to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, cies of the Legisthe Sum of Three Thousand Two Hundred and Twelve Pounds One lature. Shilling and Five Pence, to be appropriated towards remunerating the Officers of the Legislature for their services, and towards defraying the Contingent Expenses of the Legislature during the present Session, as follows, that is to say:

To the Honorable the Speaker of the General Assembly, the sum Speaker £200. of Two Hundred Pounds.

To the Chairman of the Committee of Supply, Fifty Pounds.

To the Usher of the Black Rod, the sum of Seventy Pounds.

To the Clerk of the General Assembly, and for indexing and super- 70l. intending the Printing of the Journals, the sum of Two Hundred Pounds.

Chairman of Supply, £50. Usher Black Rod Clerk, 200l.

To the Solicitor of the General Assembly, the sum of One Hundred Solicitor, £150. and Fifty Pounds.

To the Clerk Assistant, One Hundred Pounds.

To the Sergeant at Arms, the sum of One Hundred Pounds.

To the Door Keeper, the sum of Forty-five Pounds.

To the Messenger, the sum of Forty Pounds.

To the Assistant Messenger, the sum of Thirty Five Pounds.

To the Under Doorkeeper the sum of Thirty-five Pounds.

To the Assistant Doorkeeper, Messenger and Attendant, the sum of Twenty Pounds.

To the Librarian, the sum of Twenty Five Pounds.

Clerk Assistant, 100l.

Sergeant at Arms, 100l.

Door-keeper, 451. Messenger, 40l.

Assistant do. 35l. Under Doorkeeper, 35l.

Assistant do. 201.
