### ALLIES CAPTURE 5 AEROPLANES

German Aviators Pounced On As They Were Busy Overhauling Their Machines

London, Sept. 25.—The correspondent of the Daily Telegraph in France says: "There is considerable elation in the Allies' line over the capture of five German aeroplanes by a French cavalry patrol. "Twenty cavalymen, patrolling in to a thickly wooded country entered a clearing where the rich prize awaited them. The aviators and a number of mechanics at the time were engaged in overhauling five Taube aero planes. "The patrol made a dash to round up the loot, but met with fierce resistance and twelve cavalymen were killed before the airmen were beaten. Their aeroplanes will never fly again."

Thomas Nangle and assistants, after which the cortege wended its way to Mt. Carmel Cemetery, and as the casket was being lowered in the grave three rounds of ammunition were fired as a parting salute to the memory of the venerable "Soldier of the King," Sergt. ### WHY THEY CLOSED DARDANELLES

London, Oct. 1.—An official communication issued at Antwerp, says a London despatch from Constantinople, states that the newspapers explain that the closing of the Dardanelles is due to the fact that the English and French cruisers are steaming about the Mouth of the Dardanelles examining merchant steamers.

It is asserted that the Straits will remain closed until the allied fleet depart.

### Thrilling Stories From the War Area

#### Blacksmith Used Hammer

Paris, Sept. 26.—British soldiers from the Sixth Dragoon Guardsmen, in Paris for remounts, tell of fighting from Belgium through Compeigne and Sennis. They declare that in one of their charges the blacksmith grabbed his huge hammer, mounted a horse, and rode with the men, wielding his weapon with deadly effect. The British and German artillery engaged in one duel at a distance of not more than 500 yards, the Guardsmen say. The British got the range and wiped out the German gunners. Eleven guns were captured.

#### Burgomaster a Hero

Antwerp, Sept. 26.—Belgians are telling with great pride many stories of Burgomaster Max of Brussels, who is now regarded as one of the national heroes as a result of his handling of the delicate situation presented when the Germans marched upon the capital.

One of these stories is that when M. Max met the German commander and it was agreed that the invading troops should enter the city without resistance, the German officer laid his revolver on the table across which they were to confer with a great flourish. Immediately the Burgomaster whipped out his fountain pen, and with a gesture equally emphatic banged it down on the table alongside the revolver.
