OBITUARY

Mrs. John A. Jenkins

The death of Mrs. John A. Jenkins of Collinsville, Conn., took place on May 24th, 1917, at the Boston Hospital. Some years ago when she returned from the South, whither she had gone on an errand of mercy, she had a serious illness, from which she never recovered. A complication of diseases hastened her death. As Miss Annie Woodworth Best, she descended from the old Woodworth family of Connecticut coming from England in 1630.

On her father's side her ancestors were known in Murdoch's History as "The Good Samaritans." Messrs. Best and Burbridge, who could ply and relieve their fellow creatures, whether black or white. "These English gentlemen" came to Halifax in 1760, and their traits of Christian charity and kindness have passed down to Mrs. Jenkins in a marked degree. Numberless tributes from many places have been given of her generous nature, and loving devotion to those under her care. As a very successful teacher, and a graduate nurse of exceptional ability of the Massachusetts General Hospital, she is widely known and will be greatly missed. Besides her husband eight brothers and sisters survive her, five of whom came long distances to her funeral. The Hon. Clarence Woodworth Best, of South Dakota; Mr. Homer Best, of Minnesota; Mr. L. E. Best, of Vermont; Mrs. M. G. Foote, of Cornwallis, N.S.; Dr. B. F. Best, of Massachusetts; Dr. H. H. Best, of Maine; Mrs. R. S. Best, of Massachusetts, and Mrs. W. T. Hallam of Toronto, Ont.

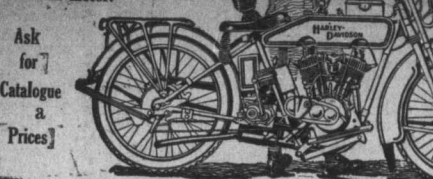
