## SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

List of Those Who Are Now Eligible for Admission to the High Schools of the Province-Over 40 per cent Fail This Year.

The following is the result of the Departmental Examinations for Grade VIII. (former standard V.) Diplomas. The number of candidates who presented themselves for examination was 932 of whom 521 were successful. Candidates who have been successful in passing this examina tion are now eligible for admission to high schools or collegrate institutes. In the case of the Grade VIII examination there is no appeal. There is nothing in the regulations, however, to prevent unsuccessful candidates from taking up the work of the junior form but the responsibility of this rests with the principals of schools subject of course to the approval of the inspectors.


