Judge's Charge in the Cooper-Sharp Murder Case.

Nashville, Tenn., March 17.—After reading the indictment Judge Hart began his charge to the jury today in the Cooper-Sharp case. He said in part: "While this indictment contains but one charge upon its face it embraces four distinct felonies—murder in the first degree; murder in the second degree; voluntary manslaughter; involuntary manslaughter. The judge defined these degrees and concluded: "You enter upon this investigation with the presumption that the defendant is not guilty of any crime, and this presumption stands as a witness for him until it is rebutted and overturned by competent and credible proof, sufficiently strong to satisfy you beyond a reasonable doubt that the defendant is guilty of some one of the offences which have been heretofore defined and explained to you."
