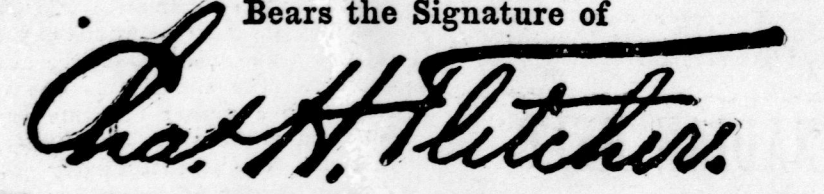

BRITISH HOUSE TO BE DISSOLVED

English General Elections to Take Place in March—Balfour With Chamberlain.

London, July 22.—The Times announces that it is anticipated in official circles that Parliament will be dissolved early in the next session and that a general election will occur in March.

In connection with this announcement rumors were current yesterday that Premier Balfour intended in October to make a strong speech in support of Colonial Secretary Chamberlain's fiscal policy and that thereupon Chamberlain of the Exchequer, Ritchie and the other Liberal ministers will resign, which, of course, would virtually compel Mr. Balfour to resign also and recommend a dissolution of Parliament.

CZAR MOBILIZES TROOPS IN EAST

And Dispatches a Flotilla of Torpedo Boats to Strengthen Pacific Fleet.

London, July 22.—The Standard's Odessa correspondent says that 123,000 troops are being mobilized from central and northern garrisons in Russia for the immediate dispatch to the Far East in case of necessity. He also reports that on the report of Gen. Kuropatkin, the Russian War Minister, an extraordinary meeting of the Imperial Council of States, which will be attended by the czar, will discuss Manchurian and cognate questions.

St. Petersburg, July 22.—Eleven torpedo boats will leave Kronstadt on the 28th inst. to reinforce the Russian Pacific squadron.

Pekin, July 22.—According to the representations of Prince Ching, the president of the foreign office, Russia, has not informed China of the withdrawal of her proposition to opening of Manchurian ports, and according to the same representations negotiations between China and Russia have been suspended for the past month. U. S. Minister Conger today conferred with M. Lessar, the Russian minister, supposedly regarding Manchurian matters.

London, July 22.—It is learned that Japan is not satisfied with the assurances Russia has given the United States in regard to Manchuria, and has been actively urging Great Britain to join her in a more energetic attitude towards Russia. Japan is persistent in urging that additional ports be opened, Japan has notified the foreign office here that Russia has ceased to present for Chinese acceptance the conditions which she presented some time ago, and which Russia denied submitting. If the ports are opened in compliance with the Japanese proposals Manchuria will be honeycombed with trade routes. The Manchurian ports suggested by Japan are Fulinhan, Tagustian, Suu Yan, Lio Yar, Seminechin and Tunrua.

CUNARDS AS CRUISERS

British Government Completes Important Agreement With Co.

London, July 22.—It is announced that the Government has completed the agreement with the Cunard Steamship Company, and that it will be shortly submitted to Parliament and the shareholders. It is understood that the Government will pay considerably over \$5,000,000 for the construction of two additional steamers, and that the whole fleet of vessels will be at the Government's disposal as cruisers. The agreement provides for an improved Atlantic mail service.

NO PLOT FEARED

Berlin Police Do Not Expect Attempt on Kaiser's Life.

Berlin, July 22.—The news that the Chicago police have discovered a plot against the Emperor was a surprise to the Berlin police, who have shown great appreciation at Chicago's vigilance and prompt communication.

Christiania, Norway, July 22.—It is authoritatively stated that the police have received no intimation from abroad of any attempt to assassinate the Emperor. It has been known for some time that a prominent American anarchist was staying in Christiania for the purpose of carrying out a plot against the Emperor. There was no intimation that her presence was anything to do with a plot against the German Emperor.

GIGANTIC DEVALUATION

Buffalo Plan Thought to Have Cleared Out \$300,000.

Buffalo, N. Y., July 22.—A defalcation, already aggregating \$300,000, and likely to be increased to a larger amount when all the facts are known, has been uncovered in this city. The clerk and trusted bookkeeper of the office of one of the wealthiest firms in this city, who handled estates valued at several millions, has been found to be a defaulter. The alleged defaulter is under 20 years old. He was born in this city, and every detail of his life was known to his employers. Shrewd real estate men, bankers and lawyers, knowing his reputation for honesty and integrity, have been deceived by his schemes. One of these transactions alone was on a stupendous scale. It involved the buying up of a tract of land 2,000 feet long in the Elmwood district, one of the finest sections of the city and converting it into a park. The clerk's employers have known of his operations for some time. It is said that he confessed when confronted, but was willing to make restitution. A desire to straighten out the firm's affairs led him to save as much as possible of the money involved, has caused them to stay the hand of the law. A "fake" charge for a large sum brought the matter to light. None of the firm's money was squandered. It was invested in legitimate business enterprises, ostensibly for "an eastern capitalist." A manufacturing suburb, it is alleged, was financed with the firm's money by the clerk, who hoped to realize quick profits and return the money.

WHEELED IN CHASM

A Galt Bicyclist Fleets With Terrible Accident.

Galt, Ont., July 22.—Ralph Roland, a blacksmith, aged about 20 years, was probably fatally injured yesterday when returning from the scene of the railway wreck. He was riding a wheel along a footpath skirting the river and turned off to allow two ladies going in the opposite direction to pass. He fell head first to the bottom. He was rendered unconscious, and besides being injured internally his right arm was broken, one rib torn away from the breast bone and his upper lip cut in two.

Dead or Alive.

Plattsburgh, N. Y., July 22.—Warden Dey of Clinton prison, has just authorized the announcement that \$250 reward offered for the capture of Peter James, the "lifer," who escaped from the prison Saturday last, will be paid for him dead or alive. It is understood that the prison guards who are patrolling the highways for miles in every direction, have orders if they encounter the convict to shoot to kill.

AFFAIRS OF THE "SOO" COMPANY

Mr. Clergue Retires From the Management and New Bonds Are Offered Subscribers.

Montreal, July 22.—Mr. F. H. Clergue, originator of the Clergue syndicate at the Soo, has retired from all active part in the management of the Consolidated Lake Superior Company.

The official announcement was made yesterday. Mr. Clergue has given up his office at the Soo and will devote his entire time to the Canada Central Railway.

This line is not in any way controlled by the Consolidated Company, but a traffic arrangement and running rights will be arranged between it and the Manitoulin and North Shore Railway, which is one of the properties of the Consolidated Company. Mr. Clergue still retains his place on the board of directors of the company.

New York, July 22.—Shareholders yesterday received formal notice of an offering of \$12,500,000 new 30-year 4 per cent collateral trust bonds by Consolidated Lake Superior Company. The bonds are offered to subscribers at 60, this low price furnishing a good illustration of the present condition of the bond market. The bonds will net investors 7 per cent.

Subscriptions will be received at the rate of \$1,000 bonds for each 0 shares of common or preferred stock. The proceeds will be used in connection with the payment of the loan of \$5,050,000 negotiated with Speyer & Co., and \$2,450,000 for discharge of current indebtedness, chiefly on construction accounts and for working capital.
