



L. & P. S. AND WATER BYLAWS INDORSED BY LABOR COUNCIL



MOTOR MACHINE GUN BRIGADE TO BE FORMED HERE; THIS BRANCH OF SERVICE HAD WONDERFUL GROWTH

When War Broke Out Canada Had No Machine Gunners, But At End of Hostilities Had Over 7,000—Militia Force of Like Number To Be Organized.

London, Military District No. 1 will have a militia machine gun brigade. This has been decided definitely, and organization is now under way, and likely will be completed early in the new year. Not only was the great war directly responsible for the revision of many accepted theories on military tactics and strategy, but it also brought about an evolution in some arms of the service, which has today produced an effective military fighting unit almost as unlike its origin as chalk is from cheese. Probably no arm of the service felt the effect of this evolution more than the machine gun sections attached to the active militia units in Canada and the territorial battalions in the British Isles. Before the war the machine gun organization of the Canadian militia was practically nil and its armament comprised a few old Maxim and Colt machine guns, plus two Vickers guns, one of which at the outbreak of war was in a hardware store as a curiosity. Immediately following the outbreak of the war, the existing machine gun sections of each battalion were increased, the newly-authorized equipment of each section being four Colt guns and the establishment, 30 men. All ranks, and this organization continued practically intact for the first 15 months of the war. Reorganization. Early in 1916, however, a reorganization took place, the result of which, following special schools of instruction, was the formation in France of Canadian machine gun companies as separate units, one company being attached to each infantry brigade. Later in the same year came the formation of the Machine Gun Corps as a distinct branch of the service, which gave an extra machine gun company to each division of four infantry brigades. Further expansion of the use of the machine gun and the adoption of a lighter gun resulted early in 1918 in the organization of the Machine Gun Corps into Machine Gun Battalions, one battalion to each division, and the formation of No. 1 and No. 2 Motor Machine Gun Brigades, which were used as corps troops. These motor brigades comprised the Sifton Motor Machine Gun Corps, formed in 1915; Eaton's Machine Gun Corps, with the 3rd Division, and the Yukon Machine Gun Corps, attached to the 4th Division. In 1916 when the corps were formed they were issued with the Vickers machine gun, 16 guns to a company. The Battalions. The machine gun battalions formed in 1918 comprised three companies of four battalions, each battery being equipped with eight guns, or a total of 96 guns to the battalion. The personnel consisted of about 100 officers and 500 other ranks. At the close of the war the Canadian corps had machine gun force of four machine gun battalions, two motor machine gun squadrons, and a cavalry machine gun squadron, comprising a fighting force of between 7,000 and 8,000 of all ranks, and including men from every province of the Dominion. It was equipped with 476 Vickers machine guns firing 500 rounds per minute, each gun operated and supplied with ammunition by four to six men. Militia United. The present proposed machine gun organization attached to the active militia will comprise one machine gun brigade in each military district. Each brigade will consist of 40 officers and 22 other ranks, and will be equipped with 72 Vickers guns. In addition to this force, there will be a motor machine gun brigade, with 40 guns, distributed in M. D. No. 4, Montreal, and No. 11, Vancouver, and a cavalry machine gun squadron stationed in M. D. No. 10, Winnipeg. The permanent personnel of the machine gun battalions will be an adjutant, a sergeant-major and an orderly-room sergeant. The remainder of the officers and men will be enrolled in the same manner as existed in the militia prior to the war. There will be two weeks' training away from the district headquarters of the battalion each year. The social amenities of life will not be forgotten for each battalion will have its machine gun club and properly furnished club-rooms. An indoor baseball team, boxing bouts and other athletic amusements will be arranged. A special object of interest to the battalion will be the welfare of returned men and it will assist in all ways possible in the re-establishment of veterans in civil life. The corps will be open to returned men and to youths who were unable to go overseas. Already the officer who is in London organizes the M. D. No. 1 Machine Gun Brigade has received a number of applications for enrollment in the new unit from both officers and other ranks, and in order to hasten and simplify the work of enrollment an office for this purpose has been opened at the armories, London, with a sergeant-major in charge.
