#### DIRECTION INDICATOR BOON TO MOTORISTS

Device Shown At Fair Is Distinct Innovation in Accessory Field.

By merely push-ing a button on the steering column, a steel arm with an illuminated arrow at its end is projected to the right or left, according to the direction which is being taken. After the corner is negotiated, the arm is drawn back into the hood of the car. It seems that this device is a great
