Thousands of British agricultural workers are anxious to migrate if their passage is financed. Officers of the overseas settlement board told me that the Canadian scheme as was cabled, looked very comprehensive, and was heartily welcomed, especially the part dealing with juvenile emigra-

The board has three million pounds annually to assist settlement schemes. Canada has so far failed to submit a scheme, therefore she has received no money. This is a pity. as the board has a balance at the end of each year which it cannot carry forward, but must return to the treasury. Australia has a scheme to assist passages by giving gener-ally one-third of the fare, but sometimes loaning the fare in full.
