PACE IS UNFINISHED

Canadian Press Despatch. Toronto, Dec. 26.—Track conditions at Dufferin Park were a trifle better today for the harness races, but only two of the four carded events were run off, with the postponed 2:12 race of Christmas Day going four heats before Texas Jim, who sold in the pools for \$2 in \$58, was returned the winner of the race that was only decided after seven heats. Baron Todd won the 2:20 trot, but the 2:24 pace is unfinished, and this along with the 2:29 pace will be decided tomorrow.

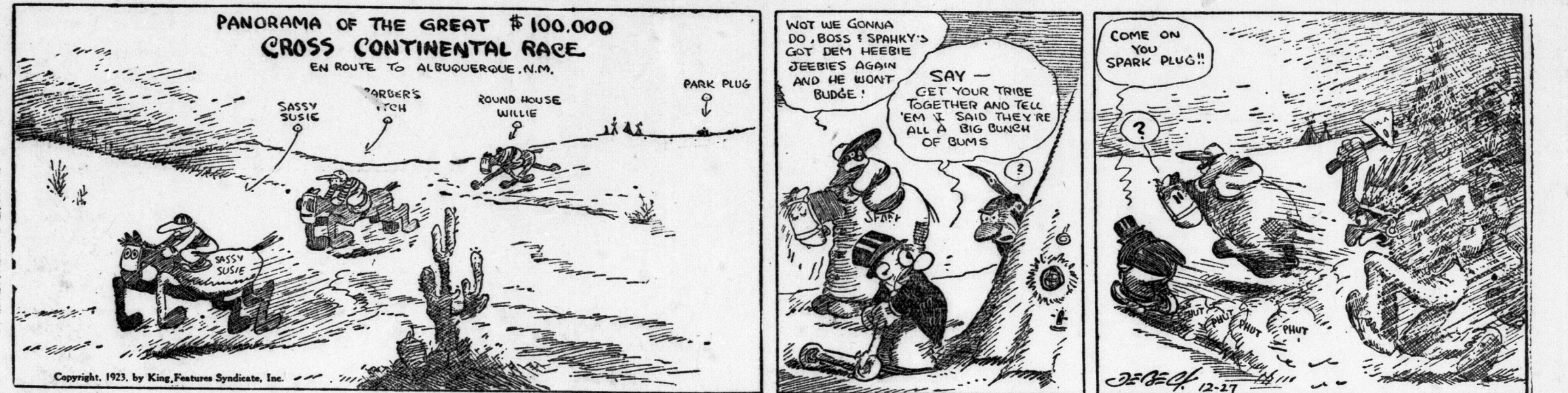
