DROWNED AT WYERS BROOK.

On the night of Aug. 28th she got up through the night and was heard walking about the house. Her brother, J. W. Angiehart, hearing her got up to make enquiries, and was told by his sister that she was not feeling well. Shortly after he retired and presumed she had done so. In the morning he found his sister missing when search was immediately made. An upset canoe was found upon the island and shortly after the body in the water along the river bank. Coroner Martin of Campbellton was notified of the occurrence and empanelled a jury, the jury bringing in a verdict of suicide. Much sympathy is expressed for the deceased's family.
