Marine News

Schr. Leo LeBlanc, Capt Richard arrived at New York Nov 21 from Digby.

Schr. Nettle C., Capt Arthur Daudet, sailed from New York Nov 22, for Norfolk.

Stmr. Valinda, Capt E. H. Lewis, sailed for Digby Monday morning to go into winter quarters.

Stmr. Bruyere, Capt Leon Everett, arrived at Las Palmas, Nov 23, and sailed from Buenos Ayres for London, Digby, Dec 1—Arrived steamer Freda, Blanche, Tidd, Little River; tern schooner Barbara W. Tower, Bear River. Cleared steamers Freda Blanche, Tidd Grand Harbour.

Tern schooner Ononette Captain Longmire finished discharging her cargo of hard coal at Commercial wharf Halifax, Thursday. She arrived Saturday from New York. When ready the schooner will tow to Liverpool to load pulp for an American port.

Ice will put a stop this month to coal and lumber shipments from Parrsboro. The shipments of lumber in the past season have been fully up to the average but the outlook for the coming winter, on account of depressed markets, is that the cut will be considerably less than usual.

A tug is almost ready at Parrsboro for launching to be engaged in the Bay of Fundy trade, and W. R. Huntley and Son are at work on a large tug to be launched next spring for the Gypsum Packet Company of New York. Her engines alone will cost over \$60,000.

Schooner Dorothy M. Smart, Capt Wm. Snow, arrived at Yarmouth Monday with 15,000 pounds of haddock, and left the same day, after unloading, for the fishing grounds. She returned Tuesday with 5,000 pounds of haddock. The fares were purchased by A. E. Nickerson.

Captain James Duncan, whose schooner the Augusta Evelyn, was lost at Country Harbor, N. S., arrived in Yarmouth Tuesday evening. The schooner went ashore on Country Harbor Ledges, Nov 29 and is now a total loss. The Augusta Evelyn which was built at Belliveau's Cove, N. S., in 1900, was a vessel of 31 tons register, and was owned by Handford Onhouse, Tiverton, N. S., with S. John as port of register.

Recent movements of Nova Scotian schooners include the Westway, 234 tons, arrived at North head, Grand Manan, from Parrsboro with a cargo of coal; J. W. Comeau, 342 tons, in port at LaHave from St. Mary's, with a cargo of salt; B. R. Tower, 343 tons, under charter to load potatoes at Cornwallis for Bermuda; Truro Queen 385 tons sailed from Barbadoes for Mobile, to load hard pine for Cuba, Cape D'Or, 372 tons, in port at LaHave from Turks Island with a cargo of salt; Jean McKay, 194 tons, at St. John's loaded with drum fish for Brazil; Stewart T. Salter, 226 tons, loading lumber at Parrsboro for New York; T. K. Bentley, 410 tons, due at New York from Port Greville lumber laden; and Minas Prince, 457 tons, under charter to carry hard pine from Mobile to the North side of Cuba.
