



TOAST .- It is singular that toasted bread so often comes to the table in anything but an appetizing condition. Carelessly made, it is black on one side and pallid on the other, or is so hard and dry that it is appal-ling to those whose teeth are not strong enough to masticate chips.

RUSKS.—To a quart of bread dough add the beaten yolks of three eggs, a half cupful of butter, and one cupful of sugar. Mix all well together. When formed into little cakes, rather high and slender, and placed close together, rub them with sugar and water, and sprinkle them with dry sugar. This quantity will fill two pans. will fill two pans.

A GOOD WAY OF COOKING ONIONS.—It is a good plan to boil onions in milk and water; it diminishes the strong taste of that vegetable. It is an excellent way of serving up onions, to, chop them after they are boiled, and put them in a stew pan with a little inilk, butter, salt, and pepper, and let them stew about fifteen minutes. This gives them a fige flavour, and they can be served up very hot.

WATERTROOF BLACKING.—Dissolve one ounce of barax in water, and in this dissolve gum shellac until it is the consistency of thin paste; add lampblack to colour. This makes a scheap and excellent blacking for boots, giving them the polish of new leather. The shellac makes the boots or shoes almost entirely waterproof. Camphor dissolved in alchehol, added to the blacking, makes the leather more pliable and keeps it from cracking? One dollar will buy material enough for a gallon.

COTTAGE PUDDING.—Three eggs, two cupfuls of pulverized sugar, four large table-spoonfuls of butter, half a pint of sweet milk, one pint of flour, and two teaspo.nfuls of baking powder. Work the butter to the lightest possible cream, beat the eggs separately, and mix the pudding the same as in directions for cake making. Bake half an hour. This quantity will make two cakes of the proper size. There is no better recipe than this for this favourite pudding. To be served hot, with sauce.

HAGGE AND SCONE.—A correspondent asks what the real Scotch haggis is: It is a kind of pudding made of oatmeal, onions, etc., baked and served in the stomach of an ox or sheep, the word haggis signifying stomach. The Scotch scone—for which she also inquires is a cake, generally unleavened; it may be made of either wheat, flour, barley, or oatmeal. In form it is round as a wheel, flat as a pancake, and—I have the word of a Scotch divine—it is sometimes as tough as sole-leather.

The following recipe furnishes an efficient remedy for coughs, colds, bronchitis, hoarseness, etc. Take the best quality powdered cubits, before and gum arabic, each, one ounce. The these add, of oil anise, one dram; and Obigle cubebs. one-third of a dram, rubbing them well through the other ingredients. Now add one half pound powdered sugar and mix the whole thoroughly; after which moisten with just enough warm water to make a very stiff mass. Dust a smooth board with a little powdered licorice root so that the mass may be rolled out with a rolling pin or a glass bottle, the same as pie crust, and about as thick as a silver half dollar; then cut into ghall troches about one third of an abour as thick as a silver half dollar; then cut into small troches about one third of an inch square, dust with a little more licorice root, and leave them to dry. If you have not used too much water, they should be hard in from twenty-four to thirty-six hours.
