They also may become Members of the Association on the same footing as Non-Commissioned Officers and men of the Volunteer Force.

The Annual Subscription to the Metropolitan Rifle Association is \$2. Non-Commissioned Offi-cers and men of the Volunteer Force may become members on payment of \$1.

N.
