CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

The lumber market has developed a sightly irregular tendency, although there is no general weakness. In pine the demand is chiefly for the export and lower grades. Box lumber continues to be bought eagerly, although it was expected that the large purchases earlier in the season would have supplied the requirements of the box trade. Wide boards of first quality suitable for the European market are particularly scarce. The only weakness is confined to cutting-up grades. The demand for lumber for building purposes has slackened, which is, no doubt, responsible in large part for the dullness

of the medium grades of pine. Mill run, 1x4 and 5, is held at \$18 at the mill. The higher prices predicted for thick hemlock have not yet materialized. While some manufacturers have held for higher prices. there has been a sufficient quantity of stock offering at current quotations to prevent the advance becoming at all general. Hardwood lumber is quite as good property as earlier in the year There continues to be good buying by local implement and furniture manufacturers, as well as for export to the Eastern States. A considerable quantity of birch has been shipped to Buffalo. The shingle market still exhibits signs of weakness, but recent developments have been favor able to white pines, which will be in a stronger position after the red cedar situation has become brighter.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

Prices of timber at Quebec continue very strong, the light production having encouraged manufacturers to oppose any drop in values. The quantity of wancy pine timber received at Quebec this season is 500,000 cubic feet less than for the corresponding period of last year. Decreases are shown in other kinds as follows: Square white pine, 10,000 cubic feet, red pine, 25,000 cubic feet; oak, 150,000 cubic feet; elm, 300,000 cubic feet. Birch and maple are the only woods that The show an increased production. spruce market is quiet. The total shipments of spruce lumber from St. John to trans-Atlantic ports during the first six months of this year were 76,000,000 feet. This is a decrease and reflects the extent to which lumber has been diverted to the United States market. Two or three large cargoes have recently been shipped to Ireland.

An event which promises to help the lumber industry is the recent formation of an association by the lumbermen of New Brunswick. This step was brought about in part by the proposal of the Government to increase the stumpage dues to \$1.50 per thousand feet, an advance which in the opinion of the lumber trade is not warranted.

MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

Nothing has occurred within the past week to disturb the lumber market of Manitoba and the Territories. Heavy shipments are being received by dealers from British Columbia. Up to August 1st of this year the building permits issued in Winnipeg aggregated almost \$3,500,000, a showing which is unprecedented and which clearly explains the large consumption of lumber. Shingles continue weak.
