



HIGH SCHOOLS AND COLLEGIATE INSTITUTES.

THE Entrance Examinations to High Schools and Collegiate Institutes for 1890 and 1891 will be held on December 22nd, 23rd and 24th, and July 4th, 5th and 6th. The following is the limit of studies in the various sub-

Agriculture and Temperance. - Papers will be set in these as optional bonus subjects. A candidate may choose which of them he will take, but it is not compulsory to take either, and he cannot take both. The examination in agriculture will be based on the first seven chapters of the authorized text book in Agriculture.

Value of Subjects.—Reading, 50 marks; Drawing, 50; Neatness, 35; Writing, 50; Orthography, 30; Literature, 100; Arithmetic, 100; Grammar, 100; Geography, 75; Composition, 100; History, 75; Temperance, 75; Agriculture, 75. Of the marks for each of Drawing and Writing, 25 will be assigned to the paper on the subject, and a maximum of 25 may be awarded as the result of the of 25 may be awarded as the result of the inspection of the candidate's drawing-book or
