Thursday last was the 55th Anniversary of the great Miramichi fire.

Nearly 35,000 persons visited the St. John, N. B., Exhibition.

The managers of the Kentville Exhibition rejoice in a surplus of \$1,000.

About 7,000 tons of Nova Scotia coal have already been received at Ottawa this season.

Wednesday, the third day of November, is appointed as a day of National Thanksgiving for a bountiful harvest.

Breslau, Oct. 9.—In the mine near Kattowitz fifty-four workmen were overwhelmed, and it is feared that fifty are suffocated.

Athens, Oct. 9.—The city is full of war-like bustle. The army daily gains in steadiness and bids fair to be a very effective force.

Of this season's crop of apples, 36,357 barrels have been exported to Great Britain, from Montreal, to date. Up to this time last year the exports were nil.

The Cunard Steamship Line has engaged to carry 5,000 barrels of apples per week from Boston to England until November. The prevailing rates at that port are 4s. and 4s. 6d.

It is estimated that there have been 3,800 cases of epizootic among the horses in New York city. Many of the fastest trotters in the city have had the disease. Mr. Bonner's stables have not yet been attacked.

Montreal Oct. 9.—Mr. Joseph Hickson, Manager of the Grand Trunk, left last night for England. It is supposed the object of his trip is the construction of a double track between Toronto and Montreal.

Queens Co., N. S., Exhibition, held on Wednesday week, was attended by 2,000 people, and was very successful. The whole number of exhibitors was 322, and the number of entries 1,025. Total receipts were \$303,75.

Portsmouth, Oct. 9.—The troopship "Assistance," which sails on Sunday, takes 50 tons of ammunition and 54 guns for the Mediterranean. There are rumors that the British Admiralty may possibly send detached squadron now fitting out, to the Mediterranean, instead of sending it on a general cruise as proposed.

The customs receipts at Montreal for the month just closed were \$612,061.62 as against \$390,789.61, the corresponding period last year—an increase of \$224,272.01. The Inland Revenue receipts for September were \$121,352.76 as against \$59,922.62 in the corresponding period last year—an increase of \$71,430.14. The increase in Inland Revenue receipts, it will be thus seen, was considerably over hundred per cent.

Ottawa, Oct. 9.—A Downing Street circular is published, with an Imperial Order-in-Council, transferring to the Government of the Dominion all British territory and possessions in North America and the Islands adjacent to such territories and possessions, which are not already included in the Dominion of Canada, with the exception of the colony of Newfoundland and its dependencies; and such possessions to be annexed to and form part of the said Dominion after Sept. 1, 1880.

Queen Victoria narrowly escaped an accident during her recent journey to Balmoral. At a station called Sollhill, not far from Birmingham, a signalman was overtaken by violent hemorrhage which so weakened him as to incapacitate him from attending to his duties. The poor fellow, however, had presence of mind enough to place his lamp on the line with the danger color facing the engine, and the driver was thus warned to reduce the speed of the train. The signalman was afterwards found lying exhausted near his post.

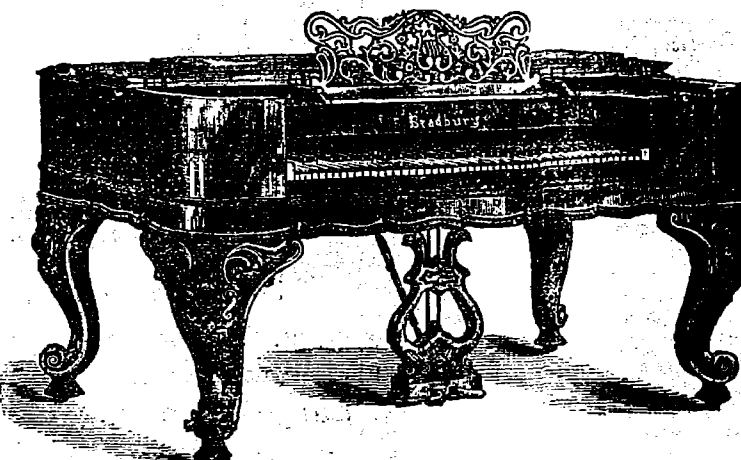
