

Charles Nixon. After completing his undergraduate engineering, entered service with the Royal Canadian Navy in 1949, served in Korea, and then pursued a military career. Held senior positions with the Department of Industry during 1963-64 and at the Privy Council Office during 1965-75. Deputy Minister of National Defence, 1975-81. Subsequent work as consultant in Ottawa, 1981-83.

Robert Campbell. Naval service during World War II. Department of External Affairs, 1944-75. Positions included Assistant Under-Secretary, Ambassador to Yugoslavia and Algeria, 1944-75. Ambassador to the North Atlantic Council, 1975-81, and Ambassador to Japan and Korea, 1972-75. Deputy Minister of External Affairs, 1981-83. Prior to 1944, service prior to 1944 included senior positions in Japan, Malaysia, Australia, and as Head of the Liaison Division in Ottawa. Ambassador to the North Atlantic Council, 1975-81. Ambassador to China and Vietnam, 1981-83. Ambassador to the Philippines, 1983-85.

James Taylor. Department of External Affairs, 1953-present. Served in Paris in 1961-64 with the delegation to NATO and the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). Subsequently served with the Canadian embassy in London, 1964-68. Deputy Minister of External Affairs, 1968-75. Ambassador to the North Atlantic Council, 1975-81. Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs, 1981-83. Ambassador to Japan, 1983-present. Deputy Minister of External Affairs, 1983-present.
