Mr. David Laughton, 57, originally from Nelson, British Columbia, to be Ambassador to Colombia. Mr. Laughton (B.Sc., B.Comm. University of British Columbia) joined the Trade Commissioner Service of the Department of Industry, Trade and Commerce in 1949 and has served abroad in Caracas, Port of Spain, Mexico City, London, Seattle and Washington where, since 1972, he has been Executive Director of the Inter-American Development Bank.
