Bill No. 60, An Act to amend The Veterans Insurance Act; Bill No. 126, An Act to amend the Pension Act; Bill No. 196, An Act to amend The War Veterans Allowance Act, 1946; Bill No. 200, An Act to amend The Veterans Rehabilitation Act.
