Mackenzie King Trust account in the previous fiscal year for the maintenance and upkeep of the buildings on the Laurier House property as well as an annual sum not to exceed 30 per cent of the interest earned on the above account for the maintenance of Laurier House as a museum and study centre and for the provision of sundry purchases therefrom, and that the unspent balance of the interest earned be returned at the end of the fiscal year to the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

- (b) An annual payment to Public Works Canada not to exceed 70 per cent of the interest earned on the Mackenzie King trust fund and the balance of interest earned for the maintenance of Laurier House as a museum and study centre.

4. The Public Archives is the Trustee of the account and there is no remuneration.

STUDY OF CONNECTION BETWEEN WEATHER AND MIGRAINE HEADACHES

Question No. 2,028—**Mr. Clarke:**

1. With reference to the announcement on January 21, 1981 of an Environment Canada study which has verified a connection between weather and migraine headaches (a) over what period of time was the study conducted (b) what was the purpose of the study (c) what was the total cost to the Canadian taxpayer of the study (d) what percentage of the total cost of the study was funded by the Migraine Foundation (e) under the auspices of which branch of the Department of the Environment was the study funded (f) what follow-up study is being made in this area?

2. Does the department engage in studies of the co-relation between the environment and health on an ongoing basis and, if so, under what auspices is this undertaken?

3. Does the government donate financially to the Migraine Foundation for independent research?

**Mr. Roger Simmons (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of State for Science and Technology and Minister of the Environment):**

1. (a) Migraine data were collected for the period April 29, 1979, to December, 1979, inclusive. Analysis followed on a part-time basis during 1980.
  - (b) The purpose of the study was to determine which atmospheric conditions might be involved in the triggering or aggravating of migraine headaches.
  - (c) Total cost to the Canadian taxpayer was \$4,600.
  - (d) 35 per cent or \$2,600.
  - (e) Atmospheric Environment Service.
  - (f) None.
2. The Atmospheric Environment Service is not currently involved in such studies on an ongoing basis.
