

that he does not like it as much as the first report. He reiterates his support in the first letter by the words "as I did the first report" in the second letter. He had not changed his mind too much in those four months.

What the House deserves to know now—I hope we will get some answers from the government—is what will the government do about these recommendations, so many of which are still outstanding. During our further examinations in the Public Accounts Committee, we will be re-examining some of our recommendations. We have a very good follow-up procedure and we will be asking for some of these answers in committee. I think it is fair, however, that the House, having heard these strong words from the minister, should now concur in this motion and in what the minister has said. The government knows from the Treasury Board that the President of the Treasury Board is losing his battle. As I say, I do not know if he is losing it in the Privy Council Office or in cabinet, but it is obvious that the President of the Treasury Board needs the help of the House. I appeal very strongly to members in the House from all sides to give the House the strength of its concurrence in the recommendations of the Public Accounts Committee.

Mr. David Smith (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Privy Council): Mr. Speaker, it is obvious and regrettable that the official opposition is using the same stalling tactic today that it used yesterday to prevent the House from dealing with Bill C-85, the Canagrex bill, which is a badly needed piece of legislation. To allow the House to deal with this legislation rather than drone on about a two-year-old report, I move, seconded by the hon. member for Lambton-Middlesex (Mr. Ferguson), pursuant to Standing Order 24:

That the House do now proceed to Orders of the Day.
