I beg to submit herewith a preliminary report on the Scientific Aptitude which were administered to the first three of the B.Sc. course during last session.

It meant going into the detailed record of each student and then working out correlations, multiple correlations, probable errors, averages, standard deviations etc. All of this data is available for anyone wishing to examine it. I have tried to put the conclusions such as they are in plain language.

As indicated in the body of the report I am convinced that this study should be continued over a period of years to provide for an adequate follow-up of the students now being tested. This is required as a final check on the tests. In addition to that intelligence tests should be included to provide another source of information.
