SUFFRAGETTES RIOTOUS AT LABORITE MEETING

Score Screaming and Fighting, Were Ejected From Glasgow Hall.

GLASGOW, Jan. 29.—(Can. Press).—Altho the Labor party is the only one which has espoused enfranchisement of women, the militants are always more obstreperous at the labor meetings than at any other. This was strikingly illustrated at the meeting held in St. Andrew's Hall tonight at which James Ramsay MacDonald, Socialist and Labor member for Leicester, presided. From start to finish his speech was punctuated by interruptions from the women. More than a score of militants were ejected, most of them screaming wildly and striking out in all directions.

Mr. MacDonald's declaration that the Labor party was out to fight for women's franchise failed to modify the militant hostility.

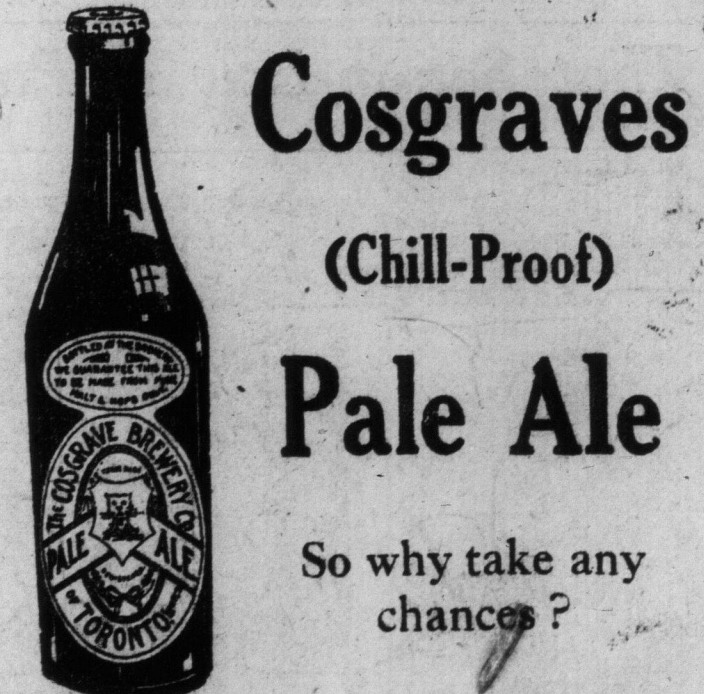
REFUGEE MINISTERS ARE NOW SAFE IN JAMAICA

Revolution Having Been Suppressed, Exiles Are About to Return.

KINGSTON, Jamaica, Jan. 29.—(Can. Press).

The steamer Sardinia arrived here today from Port au Prince, having on board August Bonamy, the Haitian minister of finance, and M. Guilbaud, Haitian minister of public instruction and justice, who fled from Haiti because of the revolution. It is reported that President Michel Oreste will reach Kingston on the steamer Prinz Eitel Friedrich. All the Haitian exiles have returned or are on their way to Haiti, including Gen. Dely, ex-governor of Port au Prince.
